In accordance with our Bylaws (available upon request), we are notifying our members that the Board will have three (3) currently serving Directors' terms expiring at the Leaders Education Foundation's fifth annual meeting in April 2024. The new terms for these Directors shall be for three (3) years each. Director Mary Lou Adams will regrettably not be able to serve another term. We thank Director Adams for her leadership and service to the Foundation.



2023 FINANCIAL PERFORMANCE



Chair Ron Hill called the 4th Annual Membership meeting to order at 5:30 p.m. at 1490 Union University Parkway, Jackson, TN. He explained that due to limited capacity, members have been encouraged to attend virtually via Facebook live with a limited in-person audience.

Chair Ron Hill lead the invocation and then welcomed the students from Arlington Elementary School. The students led everyone in reciting the Pledge of Allegiance and singing the National Anthem.

Chair Ron Hill called upon Secretary Eddie Hays to determine whether a quorum was present. Secretary Hays confirmed that a quorum was present.

Chair Ron Hill called for the reading of the minutes of the 3rd Annual Membership meeting conducted on April 19, 2022. A motion was made to dispense with the reading of last year's minutes, which are included in the 2022 Annual Report. The motion carried and the minutes were approved as presented.

Chair Ron Hill introduced the other Foundation Board Members who are:

Chair Ron Hill called upon Foundation President Leigh Anne Bentley to present the President's Report.

President Bentley thanked Chair Hill and the Foundation Board for their leadership and service. She stated that fulfilling the mission of Leaders Education Foundation is a labor of love and takes a village including the Foundation's volunteer staff, members, and corporate sponsors, all of whom she thanked for their service and/or support.

She reported that the Foundation installed a charter wall this past year at Leaders Credit Union's Oil Well branch to honor and commemorate the charter sponsors and charter members who have supported the Foundation from the beginning.

President Bentley then reported that, in 2022, the Foundation launched its new Workforce Readiness Scholarship program. Through this new initiative, the Foundation awarded scholarships to deserving students working on completing their career technical education programs. The 2022 Workforce Readiness scholarship recipients are listed in the Annual Report.

Other support provided in 2022 includes:

- \$25,000 awarded to high school seniors as collegiate scholarships
- \$20,000 awarded in L.E.A.D.S. grants to educators
- Partnership with the United Way's READ Team to financially support their expansion of services and resources, including taking books to children in different areas of West Tennessee with their Words on Wheels (WOW) Wagon
- \$7,000 matching gift to the Jackson Art's Council for its Art Box initiative
- Sponsored twenty-one (21) students across West TN in the FutureStar Youth Summit hosted at UT Martin

At the meeting, a special presentation of \$20,000 was awarded to the United Way's READ Team to continue supporting their program.

President Bentley then reported that since the inception of the Leaders Education Foundation Scholarship program, there has been a notable rise in both the total number of scholarships awarded and the dollar amount disbursed. These scholarships are designated for high school seniors who have demonstrated exceptional academic achievement and leadership qualities within their schools and communities. Before announcing the 2023 scholarship recipients, she noted that the Board had formed a Scholarship Committee, who she recognized and thanked for their service and who are Mrs. Mary Lou Adams, Mrs. Stephanie Riley, Ms. Yvetter Blue, and Ms. Linda Rizzuto. The Scholarship Committee led by Committee Chair Adams reviewed all of the applications and selected the recipients. President Bentley then individually recognized each recipient of a 2023

scholarship, of which twenty were given for a total of \$25,000 awarded. The 2023 Collegiate scholarship recipients are listed in the Annual Report.

In 2022, the Foundation awarded twenty L.E.A.D.S. Education Grants.Through this program, West Tennessee educators were eligible to enter for an opportunity to win a grant of up to \$1,000 each.The 2022 LEADS Grant recipients are listed in the Annual Report.

President Bentley then introduced the 2023 Nominating Committee Chair, Mr. Spencer Pratt. Committee Chair Pratt recognized his fellow 2023 Nominating Committee members who are Ms. Yvette Blue, Mr. Ron Hill, Mr. Seth Rudd, and Mrs. Karen Freeman. He reported that at this time and based on the Board's approval, the Nominating Committee submits to the membership the following slate of Nominees for the Foundation's Board of Directors:

- Mr. Ron Hill 2nd term (April 2023 – April 2026)
- Mr. Eddie Hays 2nd term (April 2023 – April 2026)
- Mr. Stan Sanders
 1st term (April 2023 April 2024)

Chair Ron Hill thanked the 2023 Nominating Committee for serving. As there were no further nominations, he asked for a motion to accept the slate of nominees. A motion and second were made to accept the nominations. The motion carried unanimously.

Chair Ron Hill then thanked those members joining in-person and virtually for attending the 4th Annual Membership meeting. He thanked all the Foundation's sponsors, members and donors and encouraged everyone to continue donating and, if not a member, to join the Foundation. With no other business to be discussed, a motion was made and seconded to adjourn. The motion carried unanimously.
