promote adult-child interaction around books and nature. Each panel features a reading tip to encourage family engagement by bringing the book to life for children. This student-led project of Huntingdon High School students presented the idea to the Huntingdon City Council to seek approval for installation at the Kelley Complex across from Huntingdon High School. The project has broken ground and is scheduled for completion this year.

We joined forces with the Greater Jackson Chamber and became the official Education Connection sponsor to help engage the community in education and create opportunities for business leaders to get involved. The programs supported include Pathways2Possibilities, annual Education Breakfast, Manufacturing Day, and professional development days for local schools.

We continued the expanded LEADS educator grants program, which in 2024 awarded over \$35,000 to teachers and classrooms in West Tennessee. Our support included professional development and teacher appreciation initiatives, investing in both the educators and students who represent our region's future.

We began planning for our inaugural EmpowerEd event, featuring Ramsey Personality, Dr. John Delony, which will mark a milestone for the foundation. 2024 Financial Performance



5th Annual Meeting Minutes April 16, 2024

Chair Ron Hill called the 5th Annual Membership Meeting to order at 5:30 P.M. at the J. Walter Barnes Conference Center in Jackson, TN. He explained that all business conducted during the meeting, including voting, would be decided through in-person votes cast by individual Foundation members present. He stated that the 2023 Annual Report was available at the meeting's check-in and was posted on the Foundation's website at leadersgives.org.

Chair Ron Hill led the invocation and welcomed the students from Arlington Elementary School. The students led everyone in singing the National Anthem and reciting the Pledge of Alleajance.

Chair Ron Hill called upon Secretary Eddie Hays to determine whether a quorum was present. Secretary Hays confirmed that a quorum was present.

Chair Ron Hill called for the reading of the minutes of the 4th Annual Membership meeting conducted on April 18, 2023. A motion was made to dispense with the reading of last year's minutes which are included in the 2023 Annual Report. The motion carried, and the minutes were approved as presented.

Chair Ron Hill introduced the other Foundation Board Members who are:

Chair Ron Hill called upon Foundation President, Mrs. Leigh Anne Bentley, to present the President's Report. President Bentley thanked Chair Hill and the Foundation Board for their leadership. She stated that fulfilling the mission of the Leaders Education Foundation is a heartfelt endeavor and one that relies on the collective effort of a dedicated community, volunteer board and staff. Together, we are affecting meaningful change, empowered by the generous support of our sponsors, members, and donors. With each contribution, Leaders Education Foundation is enabled to give forward and make a tangible impact

President Bentley then reported that, In 2023, the Leaders Education Foundation supported West Tennessee communities through the following initiatives:

- Established a new partnership with Georgia Pacific-Dixie, enabling the Foundation to double the number of workforce readiness scholarships in 2024 and beyond.
- Awarded \$25,000 in collegiate scholarships to high school seniors
- Provided an additional \$29,500 in postyear one scholarships to prior collegiate scholarship winners
- Partnered with the Jackson Grown Leaders Fellowship to mentor and develop the skills and networks of Jackson-Madison County School System juniors and seniors
- Provided funding for Ballet Arts and the Jackson Symphony Music Academy
- Sponsored the Hub City Innovation Cup prizes for Jackson-Madison County high school teams
- Sponsored the JMCSS Teacher of the Year awards
- Sponsored 15 students from 7th and 8th grades to participate in the FutureStar Youth Summit at UT Martin
- Sponsored the 2023 WestTeach Program, which included educators from 17 school districts across 12 West Tennessee counties
- Awarded \$35,000 through the L.E.A.D.S. Grants program, including \$25,000 for classroom grants and \$10,000 for educators' professional development and teacher appreciation grants

Before presenting the 2024 collegiate year one scholarship recipients, President Bentley noted that the Board had formed a Scholarship Committee in accordance with the Bylaws to review the applications and video submissions. She then recognized the Scholarship Committee members, Mrs. Stephanie Riley, Ms. Yvette Blue, Mr. Greg Hammond, and Mrs. Linda Rizzuto, and thanked them all for their service. She then individually recognized each recipient of a 2024 collegiate scholarship, all of whom are listed in the 2023 Annual Report.

President Bentley next reported on the Foundation's campaign with Imagination Library chapters in Crockett, Gibson, Hardeman, Haywood, and Madison counties to raise awareness of the Foundation through new members who wished to support the participating Imagination Libraries. The 2023 campaign resulted in the Foundation's total donation of \$12,490 to the participating Imagination Library chapters.

The Foundation continues to support the United Way's READ Team and its WOW Wagon. President Bentley reported that in addition to its ongoing financial contribution of \$20,000 to the READ Team, the Foundation collected and was

pleased to announce it was presenting over 3,000 books for the WOW Wagon.

President Bentley then announced the Foundation would be participating through the end of May 2024 in a support matching campaign of up to \$5,000 to benefit the Jackson Arts Council's Jackson Art Box program. The program will provide Jackson Madison County School System counselors with free art supply boxes for students to use to express themselves. President Bentley informed the membership on how they could support this program.

President Bentley then introduced the 2024 Nominating Committee Chair, Mr. Ron Hill. He began presenting the Nominating Committee's Report by first recognizing his fellow 2024 Nominating Committee members, who are Mrs. Karen Taylor, Mr. Spencer Pratt, Mr. Seth Rudd and Mrs. Karen Freeman. He then reported that at this time and based on the Board's approval, the Nominating Committee submits to the membership the following slate of nominees for the Foundation's Board of Directors:

 1st term (April 2024 April 2027)


